


MM Foundation has expanded its partnership to reach most deserving youths with very challenging socio-economic conditions.

The main objective of the AKO Scholarship Program is to ensure that students will be able to complete their studies



43 new scholarships were granted for selected students to take up skills development courses. Altogether 71 students were supported in 2019. The course categories are as follows;








UNIVERSITY OF RUHUNA - SRI LANKA (UNIVERSITY OF THE SOUTH)

SRI LANKA INSTITUTE OF TOURISM AND HOTEL MANAGEMENT, KOGGALA HOTEL SCHOOL


61 scholarships were granted students for selected needy students. These students are attached to different course categories related to hospitality industry. The details of the students are as follows;
